

Hand-dyed plant fibers, organic pigments, steel, brass, silicone - Eternal Machine merges natural and engineered elements to reflect the evolving integration of machines, humans, and technologies. Through themes like 'Agropunk' and 'Technopunk', the exhibition paints a narrative of community dissolution and potential reconstruction. It invites to reconsider the notion of shared space of today's worldand redefinition of human limits and our interactions with both animate and inanimate surroundings.
